September

September 1, 1864.

The Confederacy abandoned the city of Atlanta, GA. The following day, Union forces occupied the city, and created a major turning point in the Civil War.



September 2, 1945

WWII ended with Japan's official surrender. This marked the culmination of the war in the Pacific and the end of the global conflict.

September 3. 1973

The Treaty of Paris was signed, officially ending the American Revolution. This treaty recognized America as a nation independent of Great Britain.

The U.S. Constitution was signed in Philadelphia by 39 delegates and established the framework for the U.S government.
