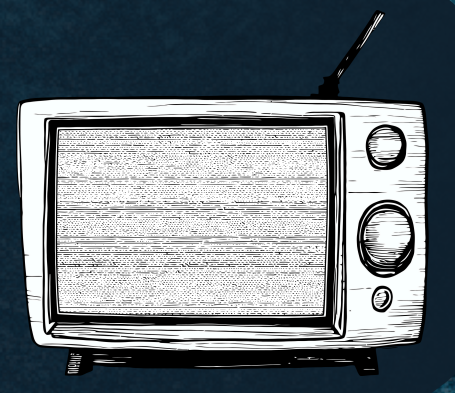



# MONUMENTAL MOMENTS IN *August*


August 1, 1981

August 21, 1878
